The examination is made up of three parts, all of which must be passed or exempted for candidates to achieve FRCS (Ophth) (Glasg):

Therefore, if a candidate has sat all of the ICO examinations listed above, and has 6 years of clinical experience, they are eligible to apply to sit the FRCS Part 3 clinical examination.
